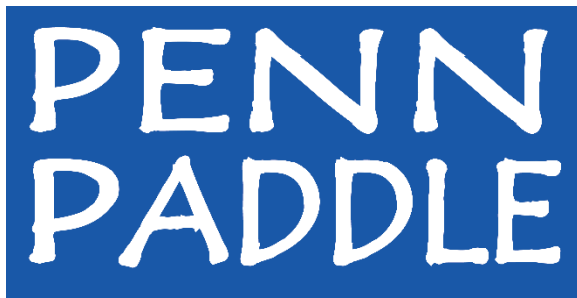


Join us for an historic paddle paired with a paddling film festival!

In 1677, the Quakers who sailed from England on the ship *Kent* and landed in Burlington bought from the Lenape Indians the land between Assunpink Creek (Trenton) and Rancocas Creek. This paddle is nearly that entire distance. Lenape Chief Ockanickon, a friend to the Quakers, is buried in the property's graveyard.
